**Epupa, water, energy,
'indigenous / tribal peoples' and chieftaincy**

with special reference to Kaoko

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Introduction

This bibliography is the result of a research trip to Namibia in 1996.¹ The originals of the listed articles are in the Namibia National Library in Windhoek and the photocopies, in the order of this bibliography, in the archives of the *Basler Afrika Bibliographien*.

The following two sections will present the background and the selection criteria on which this newspaper study was based.

Background

In the autumn of 1996 we spent several months in Namibia to investigate the course, structure and historical background of the debate around the planned hydropower scheme at the Epupa falls on the Kunene river. In the forefront was not the question of the necessity of such a project, but rather questions about the social process of negotiation around a project of this scale in postcolonial Namibia. In other words, we asked ourselves to which extent the different positions in the debate needed to be seen in relation to wider discourses, and to which extent those in the Namibian centres differ from those in a peripheral region such as Kaoko or the Kunene Region.

We started our enquiry with a large scale newspaper investigation in the Namibia National Library in Windhoek. We systematically perused all editions of three Namibian newspapers (*Allgemeine Zeitung*, *The Namibian*, *New Era*) published between 1 January 1990 and 31 August 1996 and collected 1500 articles. The choice of these three newspapers was an attempt to do justice to the political spectrum within the Namibian press.²

When in September 1996 we spent weeks in the Namibia National Library paging through newspapers, we weren't thinking of making our material publicly available. It needed Wolfgang Werner (NEPRU)³ to encourage us to publish an English version of the bibliography, which before had just been compiled for internal use and in German, and thus make it available to a wider public. The *Basler Afrika Bibliographien* made this possible, in spite of the associated expenditure, and the bibliography now appears in revised form as part of the series *Allgemeine Archivalien der Basler Afrika Bibliographien*.

The selection of newspaper articles

The newspaper articles were selected corresponding to the issues of our enquiry, with different priority given to different topics or catchwords. First priority was given to the planned Epupa project itself and the Kaoko region. From this it was possible to derive a second and third priority that contained different thematic emphases. Added to this were topics that seemed to us of particular interest and that we pursued during the whole newspaper investigation.

1st priority: the Epupa project and Kaoko

All newspaper articles hereto relevant which appeared in the specified period in the three newspapers were collected. Central to the selection was the subject at

issue, the *Epupa project*, and the geographical aspect, the *Kaoko region*. However, in their totality these collected articles make up only a small part of this bibliography.

2nd priority - water, water supply, energy, energy supply, Kunene Region, Himba

Here too all relevant articles were collected. The second priority includes two different sets of topics: one regarding matters at issue - *water* and *energy* -, the other regionally defined, supplemented by the most prominent group in the local population - *Kunene Region* and *Himba*.

3rd priority - nature conservation, environment conservation, tourism, chieftaincy.

Here not all articles were collected, but a selection of the most relevant, i.e. more substantial articles, editorials, reports, etc. The sets of topics combined under this priority were derived from the first and second priority and only belong together in a qualified sense as far as content is concerned, so that a catchword such as *chieftaincy* might not at first seem integral to the above compilation.

4. Additional sets of topics - Bushmen/San, Knermet, Epunga, borehole-saga, Olympia Rensen, seals, Kwakw Sediche, 'indigenous tribal peoples', etc.:

Most articles relevant to these sets of topics were collected. The selection of topics was derived from priorities 1 to 3: from *Kaoko* via *Himba* to *Knermet*, from *Kaoko* via *chieftaincy* and *Herero* to *Epunga*, or from *Epupa project* via *water supply* and *drought* to the so-called *borehole-saga*. Furthermore, the term '*indigenous tribal peoples*' is often used in the debate in reference both to *Himba* and *Bushman/San*.

5. The press

Furthermore, articles were collected throughout, though not in an exhaustive fashion, that were concerned with the press in Namibia. This was done in view of a later stage categorization of the individual newspapers and the importance of the press in the investigated debate.

Objective of the bibliography

Newspapers are an important source for an examination of the most recent history. Namibian newspapers are not, at least as far as the period of time here considered is concerned, archivally recorded in a detailed fashion and thus the individual articles are not easily accessible. This bibliography is a contribution towards putting this source to better use and can in particular be useful for the examination of issues around the series of topics here listed. It thus addresses researchers and scholars in and out of Namibia.

Structure of the bibliography

The bibliography comprises three parts and an index. In chronological order, the first part lists the articles in the Allgemeine Zeitung, the second those in The Namibian and the third those in New Era. The articles are numbered, whereby the numbering restarts at 1 for every newspaper. The numbering refers only to that of the copies (always of the whole page of the newspaper in original size) in the archives of the *Bundes Afrika Bibliothek*. After every bibliographical listing (the bibliography complies with the original) some catchwords as to the content of the article are given in brackets on the next line. The index at the end of the bibliography refers only to those catchwords. In using the index one should be aware that the given numbers refer to the page numbers in the bibliography and that a catchword can appear more than once on one page.
